SECOND CORRECTIVE ACTION
ORDER
[California Health and Safety
Code Section 105256]

The Sacramento County Environmental Management Department, Environmental Compliance Division ("EMD"), the "Local Enforcement Agency" in the County of Sacramento, hereby issues this Second Corrective Action Order ("Order") pursuant to California Health and Safety Code (H&SC) sections 105251 and 105256 to the CITY OF SACRAMENTO ("Respondent") for lead hazards at the JAMES MANGAN PARK RIFLE AND PISTOL RANGE ("Facility") located at 2140 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Sacramento, CA 95822.

# **APPLICABLE AUTHORITY**

# H&SC section 105256 provides:

(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, whenever the department or a local enforcement agency determines that a condition at a location or premises, or the activity of any person at the location or premises, is creating or has created a lead hazard at the location or premises, the department or the local enforcement agency may order the owner of the location or premises to abate the lead hazard, and may order the person whose activity is creating or has created the lead hazard, to cease and desist.

- (b) It is unlawful for any person to refuse to obey any order issued pursuant to this section.
- (c) A violation of subdivision (b) shall be an infraction punishable by a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
- (d) A second or subsequent violation of subdivision (b) shall be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or by imprisonment for not more than six months in the county jail or by both that fine and imprisonment.
- (e) Any penalties under this section shall be in addition to any other penalty or remedy provided by law.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

EMD received an inquiry on April 4, 2016, about lead-contaminated dust at the indoor gun range located at the Facility.

On April 13, 2016, EMD received documents that verified that a lead hazard, as defined in Title 17 California Code of Regulations (CCR) section 35037, is present at the Facility.

# **DETERMINATIONS**

Based on the above Statement of Facts, EMD has determined that a lead hazard exists at the Facility, which warrants abatement or corrective action pursuant to H&SC section 105256.

# **DIRECTIVES**

Until the lead hazard at the Facility has been abated or corrected:

- 1. Respondent shall ensure that the building interior is not generally accessible to the public;
- 2. Respondent shall ensure that the procedures for building entry and exit are followed, as described in the work plan by PARC Specialty Contractors, dated May 19, 2016, titled *Interior Lead Dust Migration*

Prevention Lead Compliance Work Plan;

- 3. The building shall not be repurposed as a "public building" or a "residential building," as defined in 17 CCR sections 35045 and 35046;
- Respondent shall notify EMD within thirty (30) calendar days of Respondent making a final decision regarding disposition of the Facility (for example, reuse or demolition): and
- 5. Prior to conducting any lead activities, as defined in 17 CCR section 35032, Respondent shall submit a work plan for EMD's review and approval that identifies how Respondent will conduct such activities. Lead activities will not be initiated prior to EMD's approval of the work plan. Measures used must comply with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) standards for Work Practices, 17 CCR sections 36000, 36050, and 36100.

All submittals required by this Order shall be addressed to Charley Langer, Environmental Specialist, Sacramento County Environmental Management Department, 10590 Armstrong Avenue, Mather, CA 95655.

As used in this Order, the date of issuance shall be the date of this Order, and the date of service, whether by personal service or by certified mail, shall be the date the Order is served on the City of Sacramento.

EMD reserves the right to make such modifications to this Order and/or to issue such further order(s) as it may deem necessary to protect public health and safety. Such modification may be issued as amendments to this Order and shall be deemed effective upon issuance.

Nothing in this Order relieves Respondent of its obligation to meet the requirements of any law, regulation, standard, permit, or order issued thereunder.

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## PARTIES BOUND

This Order shall apply to and be binding upon Respondent, its officers, directors, agents, employees, contractors, and assignees.

### **SEVERABILITY**

The Directives of this Order are severable, and Respondent shall comply with each and every provision hereof, notwithstanding the effectiveness of any other provision.

## **FURTHER ENFORCEMENT ACTION**

Violation of a Corrective Action Order issued pursuant to H&SC section 105256 is a criminal offense, punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both. EMD does not waive any further enforcement action by issuance of this Second Corrective Action Order.
